THE SUN SHINES ~ AUTHOR'S NOTES

The first section of this publication, the picture book, is designed to support early readers with the choice and size of typeface, and line breaks that allow for the smooth flow of language. The illustrations for this edition are more magical as compared with the minimalist approach of the last, and are created to encourage conversation.

The second section of this book is presented in text form and without pictures. Sentences flow to a full line, and the five short acts each appear on a separate page. Here the reader has the opportunity of focusing on the music, form, and play of words, as well as their meaning.

Speech quotes are omitted from both versions as this allows for more open and poetic reading. The last sentence has no full stop as the sun continues to shine.

As I read the second section, the words flow differently as compared with when I read the story with images. With the written text I experience words by their shape and sound, in mind or air, and through my imagination.

Words become within us. Saying words out loud, repeating them, even whispering them, transforms them.







THOUGHTS ABOUT THE THIRD EDITION

When I read words, when I look carefully at an image, or listen to music, ideas spring in to my mind. My ideas are different to yours.

What follows are some of the ideas I had when creating The Sun Shines. I hope you will read through the story a few times before reading on so that your own ideas settle in your mind and take root. It always takes me a while before I understand what I think! If someone thinks too fast, they might not think with care, and caring about everything is important as it helps us to live well.

For me The Sun Shines is as much about the love between us, as a story about how humans can use the power of the sun and moon to save the earth from the harm of climate change. It is a story that can be equally viewed of happening in a short spell, or over many years.

I think of the sun, moon, and earth and their constantly shifting relationships. They each attract one another with their force of gravity, and like humans, have different qualities. The sun is bright and big, the moon is much smaller but in the story is presented as more thoughtful and wise, and the earth is full of life and wonder.

The moon might represent a woman, the sun, a man, and the earth, someone they care for with their nature and being.

The Sun Shines is a non-threatening and positive tale about the environment and renewable energy that can be enjoyed by all ages.

This picture book has sixteen artworks including the front and back covers. The narrative and naturalistic techniques are combined with surreal elements that are dream-like, and this artistic and literary approach is known of as magic realism.

Children are far more ready to accept different ways of thinking about what they experience as compared with adults. The second edition had minimalist artworks that children readily embraced, but that adults found more abstract. This latest third edition is more accessible for both adults and children as the illustrations are more representational.

I hope you enjoy this story of how the sun and moon give, and how humans can take and use solar power, wind, and the energy from the waves to sustain human living on earth. You are also welcome to hear the music that can be played when reading the story as this may add a further layer to your experience.

I hope you return to reshape your own story of The Sun Shines over time!
